I John Storrie of the city of Savannah Taylor being of a sound and disposing mind memory and understanding do make my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say) whereas I was by a certain indenture of Lease and Release the release bearing date the twenty seventh day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty one and under Act in me the said John Storrie and Margaret my wife of the one part and William Stephens and David Dryden Mitchell Squires of the other part I the said John Storrie and Margaret my wife did for the consideration therein mentioned grant bargain sell release and confirm unto the said William Stephens and David Dryden Mitchell and to their heirs and assigns forever all that Lot of land then & there in my possession known by the number two in Beathards Lyinging between in the city of Savannah aforesaid containing sixty feet in front and thirty in depth together with buildings improvements and appurtenances thereto belonging To hold to the said William Stephens and David Dryden Mitchell their heirs and assigns forever upon trust and to and for the use of the said Margaret my wife for and during the term of her natural life and after her death then the said premises to be sold at public Auction and the

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and the one half of the said purchase money be paid to such person
as the said Margaret shall by deed or will previously limit or appoint
and in default thereof to her right heirs first and the other half of such
purchase money to and among the right heirs of me the said John Storer,
or to such person or persons as I may devise limit or appoint hereinafter
and take the same as by the said in part recited indenture of lease
and Release reference being thereunto had will more fully appear
Now it is my will and I do hereby direct the said William Stephens
and David Brydie Mitchell their heirs or assigns to pay all the said
half part of the said purchase money so by the said indenture of
release received and left at my disposal unto Archibald Clark
the son of my said wife by his former husband to the purpose of
the said Archibald Clark whom I do hereby appoint to receive
and take the same as by the said indenture of release I am empowered.
And if the said Archibald Clark shall depart this life before he shall
attain the age of twenty one years at which time and not before he shall
repay the said money (the interest thereof in the mean time however to
be applied to his use) then it is my will that the said half of the
said purchase money shall go to and be divided among my right heirs
of equal degree and their heirs and assigns and I do hereby give
devise and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my estate
real and personal whatsoever and whosoever unto my said wife
Margaret and I do nominate constitute and appoint David William
Stephens and David Brydie Mitchell Executors and my said Margaret
executrix of this my last will and testament, each singly altogether and
jointly with by me at any time herebefore made I do declare this to be
my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this tenth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and ninety three and of American independence the eighteenth.
signed sealed published and declared by the said testator
as and for his last will & testament in the presence of us who
are his friends at his request and in the presence of each other
have subscribed our names and seals at the place above written
this tenth day of July 1793
