of said State being in a weak and infirm state  
of health but of sound mind and memory and under-  
standing Do make my last Will & Testament in words  
and form following (that is to say) First. I recommend  
my soul to Almighty God, who gave it, My Body to be  
decently interred at the discretion of my Executors  
herein after named. And as to such worldly  
goods of which I am or may be possessed at the time of  
my decease I give and dispose as followeth (that is  
to say) I Give and devise unto My Beloved Wife  
Ann Ulmer One hundred Dollars. And I  
give unto my Eldest Son William Ulmer Fifty  
Dollars. and unto his child Philip Ulmer

William and sister John Popham and his wife Elizabeth my daughter I give ten dollars to them to have their child named John Philip and I give Popham ten hundred dollars to be divided amongst them three and three children to be born thereafter of those hundred dollars or until Philip comes to of age and should he die before that period the same sum of three hundred dollars to be divided amongst the children of my two younger sons Charles and Philip likewise And also to have my Will likewise that should the said children John and Philip die before the age they attain the age of maturity or die before me but or the whole or any of these three shall be divided in like manner amongst the children of my two younger sons Charles and Philip likewise as aforesaid. And I do hereby give and devise unto my son Charles some two hundred and fifty acres of land bounding on and including the land hereinafter said and the following Negroes by the Negroes Ned, Belcher and his child of five. The negro boys Prince and Lucy unto him and his heirs for ever that is his children now living viz Anne, Liza and Mary likewise I give unto Anne a little Negro girl named Sarah and Liza a Negro boy named Bob and unto Mary a Negro girl named Betsy unto them and their heirs for ever. And I give and devise unto my son Philip likewise and his heirs for ever the half part of land he now owns and the whole part of land assigned him to the Westward known formerly as Little land and likewise the following Negroes viz John, Benge, Sarah and Prince. The said Negroes to be taken away some double or the said estate by my said son Charles Philip or Belcher or any of their heirs.

them as aforesaid or at their will and pleasure. And it is further my will and desire that the income of my estate whether real or personal shall be kept together and that my Executors appoint a fit and proper person or persons to manage the same and that my said son Anne likewise be maintained out of my estate as far as respect her daily food, clothing to her apparel and every year one hundred dollars to be paid unto her for her clothing and other expenses as long as she lives and remains unmarried but should she marry the same maintenance to cease. And it is my will and desire that the last proceeds from my real estate be applied at the discretion of my Executors to the paying of my just and lawful debts. And it is likewise my will and desire that after the death of my said son Anne likewise the whole of my said estate whether real or personal both and the profits arising therefrom be divided amongst my two sons Charles and Philip likewise and their heirs who be to them and their heirs for ever. And I do hereby name and constitute and appoint Christopher Frederick of Savannah and my aforesaid son John Charles and Philip likewise of Effingham County Executors of this my last will and Testament. And by writing and subscribing all other wills by what any time or times I shall make and declaring this only to be my last will and Testament.
