Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my two youngest children Sarah Cropp & Benjamin Cropp the whole of my Undivided part or dividend of my husband John Cropp's estate real & personal, of what was possessed in his life time & what was purchased for the estate since his death, I give & bequeath the whole of my personal & personal to my said above named two children to them & the heirs of their body and it is my will and desire if either of my two children should die without issue or before they arrive to the age of twenty one, then in such, it is my will & desire that the whole of his or her dividend should go to the surviving child.

Thirdly, I constitute & appoint my sons & Law John B. Foush & John Withers my executors and Guardians to my two children. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & three, writing this to be my last Will & Testament.
