I, Ann McQueen of the State and County aforesaid, being
of sound mind and memory, do make this my last Will
and Testament, revoking all other wills formerly made.
I'mpressis, Give and bequeth to my son John McQueen
and his heirs, the Island of Catlands and its appurtenances.

in the County of Chatham, considering at the same time that he will take charge of and employ to the best advantage for his sisters and brother, those Negroes herein after mentioned which I leave to them, but should they withdraw the said property from itself and abroad, then, and in that case, my son John will pay to each his sisters and brother, or their heirs, the sum of four hundred pounds sterling.

2^d. I give to my daughter Eliza for her own separate and private use, and her heirs forever, the following Negroes. Hannah, Lizetta, Banny, Anna, Peloria Sach, Sonny, and her four children, also Sonny, and the future increase of the female Slaves.

3^d. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah for her separate and private use, and to her heirs forever, Eliza James, Ann, and her three children, Manuel, Castles, Philip, Lydia, Senah, Sambo, with their future increase.

4th. To my son William, I give Carpenter Will and his son Will, Grace, Joe, Billy, Sue, and child, Hannah and child, Maria and her two children, old Cook and Melly, and all their future increase.

5th. It is my wish and desire, that my Executors herein after named, do keep my property undivided, except the house servants, untill my just debts and legacies are paid, providing at the same time for the best education their judgment may dictate, and can be procured for my son William; the fulfilment of which duty must be considered a debt due by my whole estate, unless the portion I here leave him will fully answer that purpose; should my son William die without heirs or arriving at the age of twentyone, then and in that case the above mentioned Negroes and their increase which I have left to him, must devolve equally to his brother and sisters, or their heirs; and in the same made to his brother John for his proportion of share on Oastlands.

6^{thly}. I give and bequeath to Abigail & Elizabeth Hunter, five hundred dollars each, to be paid in the first money my Executors can command, and not before, my death until the time of payment occurs of the

With the whole of the above mentioned sum with in that case due to the surviving sister.

I do hereby constitute and appoint my son John M^cDuren, and my two daughters Eliza, Sarah, Executors & Administrators of this my last Will and Testament.
