Georgia In the name of God amen!!
I Ann Stuart of the City of Savannah and State aforesaid
Spinster being of sound mind and memory and of
considering the uncertainty of this mortal life, do make
and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner
and form following, First and principally I commend
my soul to God who gave it, and humbly hope for
mercy and forgiveness through the merits and intercession
of our ever blessed Saviour & Redeemer. As to my worldly
estate as God in his goodness hath been pleased to bestow
on me, I dispose of it as follows,
First I desire that the Doctors bills funeral expenses and

all other just debts be paid without delay.
To Mr^{rs} Ann Maxwell widow of Simon Maxwell I give
One Shilling

To Mr^r John Houston McIntosh I give and demise
my half Lot Number two (2) in Savannah in the
first Wything Anson Ward in Broughton Street and
the Improvements thereon, To have and to hold the
same to him his heirs and assigns forever. My
Mulatto Girl slave Harriet, I give and bequeath
to Miss Catherine Ann McIntosh daughter of John
A McIntosh daughter of John A. McIntosh I give
and bequeath the following Legacies to be paid three
months after my decease,

I give and bequeath to Christ Church in the City of
Savannah two Hundred Dollars.

I give to Mr^{rs} Eunice Hoq twenty five Dollars - I give
to Mr^{rs} Sarah Johnston widow of the Printer twenty five Dollars
I give to Mr^{rs} Elizabeth Box twenty five Dollars - I give
to Martha Stevens, Sister of Mr^{rs} Hoq twenty five Dollars
I give to Phillip Box twenty five Dollars.

It is my express wish and earnest desire that my
Executors effect if possible, and they are hereby strictly
requested and required to effect the freedom of the
negro boy Jim according to a deed or memorandum
given by me to Mr^r John Lawson dated the third day
of May in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and
eight, and when Jim's time is out, I request my Executors
to purchase Carpenters tools for him to the value of Fifty dollars.
All my other estate I give and bequeath to John Houston
McIntosh his heirs and assigns forever.

I hereby nominate constitute and appoint Mr John
H. McIntosh and Mr John Lawson, attorney at law to be
Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby
annulling and revoking all other Wills.

April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and twelve,
