

State of Georgia. In the Name of God, Amen.
I Charles Odingsells, of the County of Chatham planter, being sound
in mind, do, notwithstanding this my last will and Testament. I submit my
body to the grave, hoping happiness in the presence of my God.
After my funeral expenses are paid and just Debts. It is my Will that
remaining part of my Estate, be appropriated by my Executors, who
will be hereafter mentioned, in the following manner to wit: I give
and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Odingsells, the use of my
Skidoway plantation, during her natural life, together with the following
negroes by name Dinah, Job, Sawney, Cupid, and Riscalla and Deliah,
the said negroes, to her, to dispose off, as she might think proper, together with
the ten already made over to her, and the furniture in the House on Skidoway
Island plantation of every description, and the chair and two horses called
Brun & Jack, and the cattle and sheep on said plantation. I give and
bequeath unto my daughter Mary Odingsells, daughter of my wife Sarah
the remaining part of my Estate both real and personal, and the planta-
tion on Skidoway Island after the death of my wife Sarah, except such
legacies which will be hereafter mentioned. And in case my wife Sarah
Odingsells, should have a child in nine months after my death, it is
my will, the property left to my daughter Mary Odingsells, be equally
divided with said child. It is my Will the negro woman Hannah
and her children and her mother old Lucy be liberated, by petitioning
to the legislature to have an act passed for that purpose. (I have there-
fore been liberated for her faithfulness to me, in sickness and taking care
of my property for years back) and that my Executors pay her Twenty
Dollars annually during her natural life. I give and bequeath to the
latter Boy by name Anthony, son to Hannah, in Trust to, Charles Odin-
sells, Severin and Joseph Spinner, the Island known by Little Waspaw
and the following negroes Bob (the carpenter) July, Peter, Peggy, Dianina
(a child) Sampson, Bella, Flora and Hannah (the daughter of Sampson
and their issue, the said negroes to work on Little Waspaw, and the por-
tion of the crops, is to maintain him and give him an Education, and
said negroes are to be given up to him when he comes to the age of twenty
by one year, together with Little Waspaw Island, to be disposed off as he
might think proper, he will be eleven years old, the 1st of September next,
and his Freedom is on Record. I give to Mary Ann (a mulatto) who is
liberated on Record, the following negroes by name Sally, the mother of
Cesar and Daniel, in Trust to Charles Odingsells, Severin and Joseph Spinner
the negroes to be delivered to her, by my Executors, in a month after my death
to be disposed off as she might think proper. It is my Will that my
son have her child.

Wapaw, and to have provision for a comfortable subsistence from my Estate
and my Executors to pay her annually the sum of Thirty Dollars during her
natural life. It is my will a suit of mourning be given by my Executors
to Elizabeth Wilson, this boy Anthony, Mary Ann and Hannah out of my
Estate. It is my will in case my daughter Mary Odingsells, should die before
she arrives at the Age of Eighteen, at which time I deem her of age, or at the
day of marriage, if in case my wife should have a Child within nine months
after my death, the property which would have been Marys is to revert to
said Child, and in case both die before they come of age, say if a boy Twelve
one years, It is my will, my property that is left to said Children be divided
between the following persons, except the Skidaway plantation, which I leave
after the death of my wife Sarah to James Odingsells Scriven son to Charles
Odingsells Scriven, the persons names my Sister Elizabeth See of masha-
chusetts, Charles Odingsells Scriven, the Children of John Hart of South
Carolina, who married my niece Mary Scriven, and the Children of Ben-
jamin Washington Allen who married my niece Mary Odingsells. —
I leave my nephew Charles Odingsells Scriven Joseph Spencer and John
Scriven my Executors, to see this my last will and Testament to be put in execution
revoking all others, Witnessed, Signed and Sealed this fourth day of June One thou-
sand eight hundred and nine, and thirty third year of American Independence.
