In the name of God amen, J. Joseph Will of Ogeechee in the County of Chatham being sick in body but of sound mind memory and understanding do make this my last will & testament in manner following, I recommend my soul to God and my body to the earth.

And whereas some eight or ten years ago I gave to my nench Phillis her manumission & freedom, now I do hereby confirm the same & for her good management & fidelity I do give & bequeath to my executors herein after named in trust for her a lot of Land in the City of Savannah back of Mrs. Thomas Young & near Mr. Wm. McFarlan for her sole & separate use for ever & direct my executors, should I not live long enough to put up and erect thereon a snug, comfortable house and Kitchen for Phillis, and recommend her to their particular care and attention.

I give and bequeath to my little negro boy Hercules his freedom and fifty dollars per annum until he is twenty one years of age & learned a trade so that he can never be a burthen to the community.

I give and bequeath to my unfortunate daughter Maria Willis the sum of five hundred dollars to be paid out of my estate but without interest.

I give and bequeath to Pharo Mabry's eldest daughter now living the sum of five hundred Dollars to be paid in like manner as my daughter's legacy.

I give and bequeath to John Lyon, an orphan child brought up by me my tract of Land in Liberty called Crack-Tuck and also all the lots of Land in Liberty & other property which his mother bequeathed to him and his heirs for ever.
