I Christiana Lewis of the County of Chatham in the State aforesaid, being weak in body, but of sound memory and mind blessed be God, and knowing the certainty of death; & the uncertainty of life, do this twenty third day of December in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and eighty six, make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say Imprimis. I give and bequeath to my Brother Peter Grant, those two town lots of land and a farm lot of land situate and being in the township of Frederica, known by the number of One, Seventeen and the farm Lot No: fifty one, and also I give & bequeath unto my said Brother Peter Grant, the one half part of my Household furniture.

Secondly and lastly, I give and bequeath to my good friend Joachim Doel Fanning of this town of Frederica in consideration of his constant and friendly services all the residue and remainder of my Estates both real and personal, for ever and for his sole use and benefit And I make and ordain the aforesaid Joachim Doel Fanning my Executor of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I the said Christiana Lewis, to this my last will and testament have recurred set my hand and seal the day and year first above written —
