I Joseph Davis of Savannah in the State aforesaid
being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind, me-
mory & understanding and considering the uncertainty
of life Do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament, in manner & form following that is to say
Imprimis I will and desire that all my debts be fully
paid and discharged: that the debt which I owe at the
Custom House in Savannah be first paid and next
the Judgment obtained against me in the Federal Court
by Phillip Cohen, and then the debts for which I have been
sued and upon which Judgments are or shall be
obtained against me, These debts I desire may be paid
as soon as possible so that the interest on them may not
accumulate Item: I will and desire that the amount
of Principal which shall or may be due on three certain
Promissory notes given by Saul Solomon \$6⁰⁰ to me, and
which notes I have endorsed to Mr. David Leim be immedi-
ately paid to the said David out of my Estate, as he has
agreed to relinquish the interest due on the same, and that
the said notes shall then be put in the hands of Scumials
Cuyler Esq. who shall immediately sue the said Saul
Solomon \$6⁰⁰ in the said notes and hold them to bail.
Item: I give and bequeath to my Sister in Honigsburgh the
entire Isaac David the sum of Four thousand Dollars, Item
I give and bequeath to my Brother James Isaac David
of Honigsburgh three thousand Dollars, Item: I give and
bequeath to my Sister Hannah Isaac David of same place
two thousand Dollars, Item I give and bequeath to the
Hebrew Congregation in Charleston one hundred Dollars
Item: I give and bequeath to the Hebrew Congregation
in Philadelphia one hundred Dollars, and to the
Congregation in New York one hundred Dollars.
