State of Georgia planter, being of good health of body
and of sound and disposing mind and memory
and being desirous of settling my worldly affairs
do make and publish my last will and testament
hereby revoking and making void all former wills by
me at any time heretofore made.

And first I direct that all my just debts be paid

216 Item, I will and desire that the lease holdings

James Johnston acquire of one hundred & thirty acres of land on the Island of St Catharines and all the profits and advantages arising from the said lot of land, after the necessary expence is deducted be annually sent on to my Nephew James Johnston of Glasgow either in Bills or produce by my executors hereafter named in order to be equally divided amongst his male children.

Item. I farther will and desire, that the debt which becomes annually due to me by Queen Owens esq shall be remitted in Bills of Exchange by my executors to the Rev^d Mr. Kirkland husband of Wilhelmina Johnston and David Johnston of Leslie and James Johnston of Glasgow my Nephew, and Robert Bissett of Princesburg esq. I hereby appoint Guardians and trustees for my nephew David Johnston a minor son of John Johnston of Glasgow, and I trust that the Guardians & trustees herein mentioned will deposit the sums that may be sent by my executors for the use and benefit of the said David Johnston, and I trust that said Guardians will give a liberal education to the said David Johnston suitable to his talents, and all expences arising thereby to be taken from the fund. And in case of death one third part of the said fund with accumulated interest thereon shall go to the children of Wilhelmina Johnston by the said Rev^d Mr Kirkland, and the residue to be equally divided amongst the male children of my Nephew David Johnston of Leslie and James Johnston of Glasgow — Further I desire the negro woman Jenny immediately after my death to be sent by my executors to Mrs Ann Courtney there to continue and work four days every week for the benefit of said Ann Courtney and two days every week for herself, this rule must continue till the death of one of the parties, and if Jenny should be the surviving party, then she shall pay four days reasonable hire to my executors every week during her life and two days for herself. Further, it is my will that the fellows Roger and Sampson and the wench Grace do work each

of them four days every week by the direction of my
executors and two days every week for themselves
Lastly, I hereby make and constitute James
Johnston, Robert Houston and James Dixon
esq. of the City of Savannah, and State aforesaid
executors of this my last Will & Testament. In witness

in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun
dred and twelve set my hand and seal and
