State of Georgia being very sick and weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory. Thanks be given unto God
therefore calling unto mind the mortality of the body
and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die. Do make and Ordain this my last Will and
Testament, that is to say principally and first of all
I give and recommend my soul into the hands of
Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend
to the earth to be buried in in decent Christian manner
at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the
same again by the mighty power of God. And as to
my worldly affairs and what little property it has pleased
God to bless me with I wish to dispose of as follows.
after my debts are paid and then the remains to be appraised
and equally divided between my two beloved sons, the one
half to William Bolding Harrison and Edward Lawson
Harrison, I wish also for my wife Cynthia Harrison to live on
the Plantation and to have one third of what little income
there may be during her widowhood but nothing after
marriage, I leave my brother William Harrison as
Executor to this my last Will and Testament to act as such
I also wish after they have education for him to bind them
to some decent trade my two above named children, ratifying
and confirming this to be my last Will & Testament, In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
the day and year above written signed,

under bodily infirmity, and as I do knowing the uncer-
tainty of human life, and desirous of arranging my
worldly concerns, Commit my body to its parent earthly
soul to almighty God - Do make and ordain this my
last Will and Testament revoking all others heretofore
made,

Item first My Will and desire is that I may be buried on my
Plantation where I now reside, the manner of my funeral
I leave to my friends

Item second My Will and desire is that my wife should hold and have
the Plantation and tract of land whereon I now reside
containing one hundred and four acres with all the privileges
and emoluments together with nine negroes namely: Phucates
Stephen Schult, Tom, Samray, Rob. Leah, Margaret, Peter a
child, during her widowhood, but should she marry again
the said Land and negroes divided my wife to have two
thirds, and one third to go to Elizabeth Mungazer and Jacob
Buckhalter my nephew an infant child which I have
raised, share and share alike

Item third It is my Will and desire that my old negro man Qua-
mana shall be free and fed and clothed at the expense of
my Estate

Item fourth I give and bequeath four hundred seventy four acres of
Pine Land, between my said wife and Elizabeth Mungazer
and Jacob Buckhalter share and share alike

Item five I give and bequeath unto my wife my right in two sets of
buildings in Beatherville ward in Savannah Mungazer's place
and ten,

Item sixth I give and bequeath unto my wife two hundred ten and
a half acres of land in the same place
