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I, Edwards Lloyd of the County of Ogle-
thorpe, State of Georgia do make and declare this to be my last
will and Testament & hereby revoking all other wills by me
heretofore made - after my death shall be paid & satisfied,
for which payment I subject my property situate in the
County of Chatham, consisting of negro slaves & Land furniture
and stock if sufficient, exempting the slaves & other prop-
erty I may be possessed of in the County of Oglethorpe, provided
the property I may be possessed of in Chatham be sufficient
for the payment of my debts - And whereas, I did
verbally give to Mrs Mary Lloyd the widow of my deceased
brother Benjamin Lloyd during and for her natural life
the use of my dwelling house, Office & garden ground & ap-
partenant thereto, situated in the district of White Bluff
Chatham County - My will is that the same be and
remain in her possession, use & occupancy, according to
my original intent, provided that there be a sufficiency
of property in Chatham to discharge the claims that may
be against me -

The residue of my property wherever
it be situated & of what ever kind - I give devise, & be-
queath to my wife Sarah & Lloyd & my daughter Re-
becca Francis Lloyd the said property to be kept togeth-
er and improved for their joint use, until my said
daughter shall have attained to the age of Eighteen
years, at which time the property to be divided equal-
ly between them, share and share alike, but in case of
the death of either before the said child shall have at-
tained the age of eighteen years the property to become
vested in the survivor, I nominate, constitute & appoint
my wife Sarah & Lloyd, ^{my co-executors} & Charles A Redd of Clarke
County & Thomas Edwards Lloyd of Chatham County, both
of the State aforesaid my executors.
