loved Sister Mary D. Power all my negro Slaves to wit.
Tom, Bess, Lempster Nanny, Eve, and Fanny, with the futures
issue and increase of the said female Slaves. All my plate
Household furniture, and all my debts and rents due or to be-
come due to me. It is my intention by this my last Will
and testament to give devise and bequeath, and I do hereby
give devise and bequeath to my said Sister Mary D.
Power all my estate both real and personal of every
nature and kind whatsoever whereof I may die seized
and possessed of, or entitled unto, To have and to hold
my estate given devised and bequeathed as aforesaid
to her the said Mary D. Power by her executors ad-
ministrators and assigns forever. And I do nominate the
said Mary D. Power to be sole executor of this my
last Will and testament, revoking all other & former
Wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & Seal this twenty sixth day of April in
the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and

Fifteen.
