I, Ann Elizabeth Irvine, of the County of
Chatham State of Georgia, Wife of John Irvine of the
County & State aforesaid. Practitioner of Physick
being weak of body but of sound mind, and understand-
ing and considering the uncertainty of Human
Life do make this my last will and testament as
follows that is to say as to the ordering of my
funeral I leave it entirely to the discretion of my
said Husband, the said John Irvine And I give
to my son Alexander Irvine for the sole and depe-
rate use of his wife Sarah Irvine and such Chil-
dren as he may hereafter have the negroes, Supe-
ter and Laura, with the future issue of the Female
also six silver table spoons the same not to be
subject to his debts and I give to my son Kenneth
Irvine the Boy Charly and one silver Ladle & four
spoons to him by heirs and assigns forever and I
give to my daughter Ann Bulloch widow the boy
William the same to be to her ^{when} heirs and assigns, for-
ever and I give to my grandson James Stevens
Bulloch son of my said daughter Ann Bulloch the
youngest child of the wedded Hester to him by heirs
and assigns forever and I give to my daughter
Margaret Irvine the following four negroes -
Dolly, Little Dol, Corah, & Sim. with the future issue
of the Female, the same to be to her and her heirs and
assigns forever - and I give to my daughter Elizabeth
Baillie wife of Mr. Thomas Baillie Merchant the
two negroes named Sarah and Beckley with their
future issue and increase the same to be for her sole
and separate use exclusive of her said Husband and
after her death then to her issue and I give to my
daughter Sophia Evans wife of William Evans -
Elizabeth the negro = Ann Eliza Irvine - fellow name
Sarah the same to be to her ^{when} heirs and assigns for-
ever and I give and bequeath the remaining
negroes Mary, John, & Mary, September -

Old Pompey, Jim, Hester, Little Tom, Fina, Mary
with the issue and increase of the females slave
to my daughter Ann Bulloch, Margaret Irvine and
Isabella Irvine for their joint use and to be
worked in the most advantageous manner for the
support. but in the event of my daughter Isabella
marrying then and in that case, I give to her ^{issue} ~~her~~
and assign forever either of the negroes Hester or Fina
as she may choose with the future issue of such
wench as she may so select. And the remaining
negroes above bequeathed to my daughter Ann
Bulloch, Margaret & Elizabeth Isabella Irvine
for their joint benefit of give and bequeath (in
Case the said Isabella should intermarry) to my
said daughter Ann Bulloch and Margaret Irvine
their heirs and assigns to be equally divided between
the said Ann Bulloch and Margaret Irvine.
But it is my will expressly that if the said Mar-
garet Irvine should die without intermarriage
and having issue then her part or proportion of
the property by me last devised to her to be equally
divided among my other children share & share
alike. — As to the landed Estate in the County
of Camden It is my will, and I do hereby au-
thorise, empower and direct my Executors here-
-in after named or a majority of them to dispose
of the same to the best advantage either at Public
or private sale, and the monies arising from the
sale to be equally apportioned and divided among
all my children share and share alike. I will
and direct the same disposition to be made on the
Two lots in the town of — Cheney River —
Sandy in the County of Liberty that I have de-
voted with the land in the County of Camden —
I do hereby will, order, and direct that the
Plantation called Danane in the County of
be retained as my Estate for the use of my children
allowing all or any of them who may possess
to plant the same and work their negroes
untill all my children have an equal share
Sandy when all my said children's share have been divided
I shall divide the same among my children
or I shall divide the same among my children

a preference to either of my children who may
be able and have a wish to purchase said Plante-
station and the monies arising from such sale to be
equally divided among my children share and
share alike. — My son Charles Irvine in his
lifetime received considerable property and bene-
fitted from my estate more than I can give to
either of my other children hence I have not made
further provision for his children. — AND I do
hereby nominate and appoint my sons Alexander
Irvine & Kenneth Irvine. and my friends John
Elliot of the County of Liberty and William B
Ball, Jr. of the City of Savannah Executors of the
my will. AND I do hereby revoke all wills here-
tofore by me made and declare this only to be
my last Will & Testament IN WITNESS
Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
at Catfish Park in the County of Chatham —
aforesaid this twenty eighth day of April in
the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
dred & Seven. — Ann Eliza Irvine (L.S.)
