to the best of the deponent's knowledge & belief & that
he the deponent & George Atkinson & Jacob Shaffer
subscribed their names as witnesses thereto in the pres-
ence of the said Testator at his request and in the
presence of such other

In the name of God amen, I Curice Hogg of the City of San
annah in the State of Georgia, being of sound and disposing
mind do make and constitute this my last will & testament
in manner and form as follows.

First I leave my immortal Soul to my Creator, beseeching him to
receive and accept it through the merits and for the sake of my
beloved saviour Jesus Christ our Lord
Secondly My Will is that all my just debts and funeral expenses be
paid, out of the income of my estate, or out of any money that

may be due me.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my Nephew Thomas Dixon the Services and profits arising from the labors of my negro man Sandy, and my negro woman Tyra and girl Amy and their future issue, during his natural life, and at her death the said negroes with their issue I leave to be equally divided between the lawful issue of said Thomas Dixon to them and their heirs forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Niece Ann Stephens Norton the use and profits of all the residue of my property, and goods and chattels of every kind that I may be possessed of, at the time of my decease together with the future issue of all my negroes (except those bequeathed to Thomas Dixon) during her natural life, and at her death, I give and bequeath all said negroes with their future issue to her children to be equally divided between them share & share alike to them and their heirs forever.

Fifthly My Will is, that should my executor deem it expedient to sell any of my negroes herein bequeathed for the good of my above named heirs Thomas Dixon and Ann Stephens Norton and their issue, I fully empower him to sell any of them, and purchase other property in the stead thereof, & place the money in some fund, that he may think most profitable for the use of my said heirs.

Sixthly I nominate and appoint George Allen Esquire Attorney at Law of Richmond County Georgia, and my niece Ann Stephens Norton of St. Lukes Parish S. Carolina Executors and Executrix of this my last Will and testament made this 5th day of June in the year of our Lord 1815.

all other declare this to be my last Will & Testament in man-
ner & form following. That is to say.

1. My will is that all my just and lawful debts be paid as soon as
possible after my decease
2. I give & bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary Bece (she paying
my funeral charges) the Lot of Land which I now live that is
to say Lot number seven (7) Neathcote Ward Belitha Trything in
the City aforesaid containing Sixty (60) feet front and ninety
/90/ feet back /or deep/ with the Dwelling House and kitchen and
all the Houses & appurtenances thereunto belonging or in anywise
appertaining as also all the debts due to me or which may
here after become due to be discharged by her fully & freely for
and during her life
3. I further give & bequeath unto her my said Wife Mary all my
personal Estate as well all my Household and kitchen furniture
as all my other personal property, not hereby expressly named
the whole to be possessed by her as her own right & property and
to be disposed of by her as she may judge proper. !!!
4. My will is that after her Death, the lot of Land aforesaid be divided
half and half alike between my beloved Step Daughter Lydia
Broughton and my beloved Step grand Daughter Elizabeth Mary
Judith Bryan, that is to say the Eastern side of said lot of Land
to contain thirty feet front and ninety /90/ feet back /or deep/
with the buildings thereon at the time of my Death I give to said
Lydia Broughton to her Heirs & assigns for ever, and the western
side half also to contain thirty /30/ feet in front & ninety /90/
feet back /or deep/ with the buildings thereon at the time of my
Death I give to my said Step grand Daughter Elizabeth Mary
