the approbation and Execution in the said  
Will and Testament, and the committing the  
administration of all and singular the goods  
Chattels Rights and Credits which were of  
said Deceased and also the auditing and  
Calculating and reckoning of the said  
Estimation and a final distribution  
to my executors the same to be done

Chattels rights and Credit of the said  
Decedent any way concerning his last will and  
Testament was committed to Isaac Wayne  
Executor in the said testament named, he having  
first been duly sworn well and truly to ad-  
minister the goods Chattels rights and Credit  
of the said deceased and make a true and  
perfect Inventory thereof and exhibit the

I Major General Anthony Wayne Commander  
in Chief of the Legion of the United States of  
America being in perfect health and of sound  
Mind memory Considering the certainty of death  
and the probability that that event is not far  
distant from the awful & solemn interview now  
on the point of taking place between this Army  
& the hostile Savages of the West have determined to  
make this my last will and Testament in manner  
following, That is to say I give & bequeath all my  
land & estate called Waynesborough situate in  
the township of East Town & Willis town in the  
County of Chester & State of Pennsylvania con-  
taining five Hundred acres (be the same more  
or less) to my only and beloved son Isaac  
Wayne (Student at Law) his Heirs and assigns  
on Condition that he releases all his right and  
title to and in a certain lot on a three story  
brick House and Tenement situate in the City  
of Philadelphia between Market and Leaden  
Streets on the East side of Second Street to his  
Heirs and assigns.

I also give and bequeath a certain lot of Land  
situate in the Town of Harrisburgh in the County  
of Dauphin and State aforesaid to my son  
Isaac Wayne his heirs and assigns; I give and  
bequeath to my only and affectionate daughter  
Margaretha Atlee wife of William R. Atlee Esq.  
etc her heirs and assigns the lot of Land and  
Thre Story Brick house thereon erected situate  
on the east side of Second street between Market  
and Walnut Streets in the City of Philadelphia  
as before mentioned. I also give and bequeath  
to my said Daughter Margaretha her heirs and  
assigns all my donation lands granted to  
me by the Legislature of Pennsylvania as  
a small Compensation for my services as a  
Brigadier General during the late war, situate  
in the western parts of that state being fifteen  
Hundred Acres more or less, I give and  
bequeath to my son Isaac Wayne his heirs  
and assigns the fifteen hundred acres of  
donation lands granted by the Congress of  
the United States of America as some retribu-  
tion for the loss of Blood I sustained in the  
defence of the liberties of America in many a  
well fought field from the frozen lakes of  
Canada to the burning lands of Mexico. I  
also give and bequeath to my said Son Isaac  
Wayne his heirs and assigns a Certain tract  
piece or parcel of land containing fifteen  
Hundred acres more or less of inland River  
swamp situate on the head of the tide water  
of the little Settlement in the County of Camden  
State of Georgia known by the name of  
Hazzards Corner as particularly described  
I described in a Deed of Conveyance made  
me by William Hazzard Esq. of the city of  
South Carolina in the year 1785 of which  
bequeath my large landed Estate  
of Nova Scotia situate on the River  
Acadie, St John and Chabot with the  
polig Poulain
