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This is the last will & testament of
me George Haig of Savannah in the Co. Chatham
My Will & desire is that all my just debts
be paid as soon as may be after my decease I give
& bequeath to my much loved wife the Keturah
Mcgrew with the increase which I purchased from
Emanuel Mambertid to hold the same during her Widow
hood and no longer; and upon her marriage or death
I give devise & bequeath the same to the child with which
my beloved wife may be pregnant at this time &c &c &c
I give devise & bequeath to my said wife
all my plate & household furniture of every description
& her Executors administrators & assigns. To each
of the Children of my Dear Brother Dr. Haig I give
devise & bequeath the sum of Two thousand Dollars to
be paid to them as soon after my decease as it can be
done without injury to my estate

All the Rest and residue of my Estate real
& personal I give devise & bequeath to the child with
which my dear wife may at this time be pregnant
to such child his or her heirs executors administrators
& assigns for ever - I desire and request that my
negro man Sam may be permitted to be as free as he
can be according to the laws of the Country as a reward
for his faithful services to me. I nominate constitute
& appoint my dear wife executrix, my brother Doctor
Mahan Haig & my friend Alexander Telfair Execu-
tors of this my last will and testament to witnefs
whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name &
affixed my seal this third day of December eight
teen hundred & seven -

Haig his heirs executors administrators & assigns. I mean if my said child dies before the age of twenty one & without being married.
