Proctor, all my estate both real & personal during her life. after her death I devise & bequeath all my aforesaid estate, in trust both real & personal of whatever nature it may consist to be equally divided between the two sons of my Brother Stephen, viz. Bryan Proctor & Richard Proctor and their heirs for ever. But nothing is herein intended to deprive my Brother Richard Proctor of my May River Plantation or such of my negroes as are at present in his possession. On the contrary, It is my will & I do hereby give & bequeath to him, the aforesaid plantation & negroes during his life & not until after his decease shall the said plantation & negroes become the property of my wife or my brothers sons. I nominate & appoint my wife H. T. Proctor Executrix and my Brother Stephen T. Proctor, executor of this my last will & Testament signed, sealed & delivered by the Testator at his last will and Testament in the presence of us who in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses this twenty third day of December one thousand eight hundred & sixteen.
