and intending with the will of God, soon to embark
on a distant Voyage am induced to make this my
last Will and testament.

I give devise and bequeath to my brother William
Whitefield for the purchase of mourning the sum of
one hundred dollars, also all my claim to a five
acre ^{land} lot bequeathed by Genl James Jackson to our
Brother Thomas, of which I am entitled to a moiety,
as one of his heirs, also my watch and wearing ap-
parel if to be found. I give devise & bequeath
to Miss Bellamy Crawford Robertson, to whom I am
bound by an ardent affection, the just and residue
of my estate real and personal to have and to hold
the same to herself her heirs and assigns forever

It is my wish to have exchanged if possible my moiety of
lot No 6 in fourth by thing Penolds Ward in the City of Sa-
vannah, for my brother's moiety of Lot No 6 Belitha Ty-
thing Heathcote Ward in said City: the improvements
on the latter lot may counter balance the more central &
eligible situation of the former, any difference in value
must be made up in Cash: to this I solicit the attention
of my executor, it being my desire that the whole of the afo-
said Lot No 6 Belitha Tything Heathcote Ward be
owned by Miss Robertson rather than a moiety of
both lots. To the said Bellamy C. Robertson I give
as aforesaid my ten shares in the Stock of the planters
Bank, also any profits that may be due to me arising
from the business of Johnston & Whitefield, and all
and every other property that I may be possessed of
at my decease, I give devise and bequeath to the aforesaid
Bellamy to herself, her heirs and assigns forever, and I do
hereby nominate and appoint my best friend and friend
Father Col. James Johnston executor and his niece Bellamy
C. Robertson executrix of this my only Will, as witness
my hand and Seal the twentieth November 1812 -

mas Pitt of the County of Chatham in the City of Savan-
nah being weak in body, yet of sound mind and do-
memory and understanding, blessed be god for the same
do make, publish and declare this my last will & testament
First, principally I commend my Soul in the hands of
almighty God who gave it to me, my body I desire
may be decently entered at the discretion of my executor
and executrix, and as for such worldly property as
I may die seized and possessed of whether real or
personal after paying all my just debts & funerals
expences. I give devise and bequeath to my beloved
wife Ann Pitt, my son Thomas Pitt, Sarah and
Ann Pitt my two daughters to be equally divided
between them share and share alike except my
negro boy Paul, who I give and bequeath to my
Ann Pitt) to be given to each of my said children
when they shall severally attain the age of twenty one years
or on the day of their marriage which shall first happen
and that during the norage of my said children
whole property shall be kept together in one
stock for the maintenance of my said wife
