for the County of Chatham and State aforesaid, per-
sonally appeared D. D. Williams who being duly
sworn saith, that he was present and did see Patrick
McHenry, sign seal publish and declare the within
instrument of writing to be and contain his last Will
and testament, that he was of sound mind at the
times to the best of this deponent's belief and that
Noble W. Glen and Thomas Wornack together
with himself subscribed their names as witnesses
at the request and in the presence of the said Testa-
tor and of each other. D. D. Williams
Sworn to the 23^d day of June
1813.

June 23^d 1813 then qualified Thomas Gribben
as executor

In the name of God, amen:—

I Henry McIntosh of Cumberland Island in
the State of Georgia, planter at present in Savannah
being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind
and memory do make declare and publish this my
last Will & Testament in manner and form as follows
that is to say. Imprimis. I give devise bequeath
unto Maria Bayard, Jane Bayard, Margaret
Bayard, and Edward Bayard, children of my
beloved sister Betty Bayard wife of doctor
Nicholas S. Bayard, and to such other child
or children of them the said Nicholas S. Bayard
and Betty Bayard as may hereafter be born in
lawful wedlock, or within a competent time after
the death of the said Nicholas S. Bayard (should
he die before the said Betty Bayard) and to their
heirs and assigns forever, all my estate both real
and personal (except such of my negroes as have
been freed and herein after to be mentioned) equally
to be divided between them share and share alike
I give and bequeath to my friend Ray Sand
of Camden County, my riding Horse Saddle and

Bridle, and my boat called the "Nancy."

And I hereby declare it to be my wish, wish and desire, that my executors hereinafter named shall be the Guardians and protectors of the following names whom I have freed, and by an act or acts of the Legislature effectually secure to them their freedom and the privileges of freemen to wit, Mary & her children Shmael, Patty, Anthony and Louisa, Judy, Rose and her child Nancy, and the said Mary, Shmael, Patty, Anthony, Louisa, Judy, Rose and Nancy are hereby declared free from any bondage or servitude that may be required by any executors, legacies or any other person or persons whomsoever to be performed by them —

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint the said Nicholas S. Bayard and Play Sands executors of this my last will and testament, ^{hereto} revoking all former will and wills by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty second day of April eighteen hundred and ~~thirteen~~ ^{fifteen} signed, sealed, published and Henry McIntosh Esq. declared by the said Henry McIntosh to be his last will and testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names, as witnesses in the presence of the said Testator.

Philip Fox^{sr} Bidore Stouff^{sr} Georgia, Before D. Pendleton Esq. the Honorable the Court of Ordinary for the County of Chatham in the State aforesaid personally appeared Daniel Pendleton who being duly sworn saith, that he was present & did see Henry McIntosh dec^d. sign seal publish & declare the foregoing instrument of writing to be and contain his last will and testament, that he was of sound mind at the time to the best of his belief and that Philip Fox and Bidore Stouff together with himself subscribed their names as witnesses.
