G. T. G. W. Whereas I Jane Cochran wife of
James Cochran Esquire, was hitherto in
my own right and, previous to my Marriage before
of the following Negroes namely, Toby, Will, James,
Tom Sally, Linda, Delia, Dick, Hanako, Warwick
Phillips, Andrew, Wilks, Peg, Bristol, Blancy, Pame
ela, Will, Anna, Boatswain and Adams, and
also in Possession of a Plantation on Little
Ogeechee Containing Two Hundred and Ninety Acres or
thereabouts, with a Stock of Horses and Cattle. And
Whereas in and by Certain Marriage Articles, made
and entered into Between me the said Jane, hitherto
Jane Delagall, the said James Cochran, and
Josiah McLean a trustee bearing date the Twelfth
Fourt^t day of June one thousand seven Hundred
and Eighty three, it is amongst other things there
agreed upon and stipulated Between the Contracting
parties in these words "And it is further pro-
vided upon the Special Trust and Confidence here-
Created expressed and declared that should the
said Jane Delagall during the Coverture with her
said intended Husband James Cochran die in
this life, in that Case, the said Josiah McLean and
his Heirs shall Stand Seized of one moiety in Manner
of the above mentioned Negroes and their posterity
and increase and after by the aforesaid Trustee of the
or Plantation on Little Ogeechee to the only Person
and behoof of such Person or persons as the said
Jane shall by her last will and testament
bequeath or give the same to, provided also
that no will or Testament to be made in Part
the powers herein reserved by the said Jane
shall intend, or be construed to cover
the said James Cochran or
Moiety of Negroes and their posterity
and increase and of the same.

in Trust of Land on Ogeechee during the Term of
the Natural life of the said James Cochran
Now in Virtue of the Powers so given and
the rights reserved in the said Marriage articles
of the said James Cochran being very sick and
weak do Make my last will and testament
in manner following, I give Devise and
Bequeath immediately after the Death of my
said Husband James Cochran to the Child or
Children that now are or may be living at my
Death of my Niece Sophia the wife of Joseph
McLean the full Value of one Moiety of all and
every Negro Slave and Slaves herein before
named, and of their issue that may have been
born since my marriage or shall be born after
my Death, with all my right Title and property
in and to the said Plantation or Tract of Two
Hundred and Ninety Acres of Land on Little
Ogeechee aforesaid. To Have and to Hold the
said Full Value of one Moiety of the said Negro
slaves, their Present or Future issue and In-
crease with all my Right of the said Plantation
unto and amongst the said Children of my Niece
Sophia McLean, that now are or may be living
at my Death: and it is my Desire and wish that my
executors herein named divide the said Property, so
by me given in equal proportion and among such Child
or Children and place the same in the most secure
manner as will tend to the Interest and advantage
of such Child or Children without the Intermeddling
of either their Fathers Mother or other person.
I Appoint my Friends Peter Devany, Joseph
Hubertham and William Stephens executors of
this my Last Will and Testament In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and
Seal this 11th day of August in the Year of our
Lord One thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety
Three.

Bonabellia, or Savannah,

May 25th, 1809. State of Georgia

My Will is, to wit, I appoint Richard Mary
Stague, (maning States) and Thomas Dechenay, (Liquors,) my Exe-
cutors and acknowledge to owe to Mr. Thomas Dechenay, the sum of one
hundred and thirty seven Dollars for one house and sundry goods
purchased at the sales of the late Robillard, of which I intend to
pay the interest to his daughter Katy, now living with Mr. Dechenay.
Besides, I ought to owe to Mr. Dezenet his attendance
on my last illness of the 3rd October, 1808, and to Mr. Stague, six or
seven visits.

To Mr. Andrew Survey, (maning Lucy) seven dollars the
balance of account for three casks of Powder he purchased
in Philadelphia or New York and seventeen dollars which I
owe to my friend Missall on a sum of fortyfive dollars, he was
enough to lend me for purchasing my cows, and for which he
bearer of my note.

Besides, I owe to Doctor Stoy, the sum of eleven dol-
lars, to wit, ten for a boat he sold me, and one for the boat he
bought. Also, I owe him a kind of a shill of
land of Bonabellia, on which he was never
till last year, when he sent his son in to
withdraw for the purpose of changing his
