Printer being at present of sound mind and memory
although laboring under bodily infirmities and
knowing the Certainty of Death, but not the time
the awful Change will take place do desire that
this may be Considered as my last will and Testament
and that my wife Sarah Johnston be my sole
executrix and Carry the same into effect. The
turbulence of the times in which I have lived has
put it out of my power to acquire for my family what
I have been Justly entitled to by many years hard labor
and my property at this time is so very inconsiderable
that it will not admit of a division, therefore well
Knowing that my wife will not apply it improperly
I do Bequeath (after payment of my Just debts) the
whole of my estate (both real and personal) to my said
wife, Confident that if it amounted to millions I should
not repose it in better Hands. - The ground which I
now occupy was in the Year one thousand seven hund-
red and seventy eight (to the best of my remembrance,
together with the buildings thereon erected Confisca-
-ted by the Legislature of the State on account of my
attachment to the Government under which I was
brought up, but was afterwards given up to my
wife, again in the Year one thousand seven hundred
and eighty two the Legislature Confiscated it as my
Property for the Cause before mentioned to wit, attach-
ment to Great Britain my native Country, but after
a due Course of Law was decreed to be the property
of my wife, should it at any time be found that I
had a legal right in the said property, the act of
attainder notwithstanding I desire that the property
may be looked upon as included herein, to wit the
Property of my wife, All the other property I was
possessed of at the time of the last act of attainder
having remained unsold at the time of my return
to the State in September one thousand seven
hundred and eighty two of Course reverted to me
and I hereby bequeath it as aforesaid to my wife
In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal at Savannah this 10th day of September 1817
