hold Furniture, debts due me, or any other effects I am possessed of.

Thus It is my Will that my willment take place without any
alteration or unnecessary expense.

Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my friends Edward Star-
buck and Richard Teate, and my brother James Brickell, ex-
ecutors of this my last Will and Testament hereby expressly re-
voking and annulling all former or other Wills by me
made. Dated the fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and nine.
