and nine hundred and fifty Dollars to be equally
divided between them share alike if John Elizur
both christ is dead and his husband alive, then he
draw four hundred Dollars out of the above sum, I
give fifty Dollars to the poor of the village of Elizur
posth. I give to Ann Jackson on her arrival at
age of eighteen years five hundred Dollars to be
real estate and negroes I give and devise the
my wife during her life & thereafter to her
issue, if she leave any if not the land is to go to

to be sold & the net proceeds I give to the same person that I have given the seven thousand nine hundred & fifty dollars. And as to the rest and remainder of my estate I give the same to my said wife Ann Dubelle her heirs and assigns for ever. I desire that no inventory of my estate be taken. — I appoint my wife Ann Dubelle executrix & Frederick Webb Jr. Jeremiah Caylor executors to this my last will — Savannah June 24th eighteen hundred fifteen.
