In the name of God Amen. I, John Woolf
of the County of Chatham in the said State of Georgia
being of sound mind and memory and understanding
but considering the uncertainty of this Life do make
this my last will and testament in manner and
form following that is to say I give bequeath unto my
beloved wife Penelope Woolf one mare, bridle & saddle
one riding chair four cows & calves four ewes & lambs
seven head of merchantable hogs, the first choice
and one five year steer three cows and pigs to be
killed in the fall one feather bed and bedstead & furni-
ture; belonging to it I do give my son George Woolf an
negro man named Leven my set of blacksmith tools
and rifle gun. I do give unto my beloved wife Pen-

Truslow Woolf my house & five acres of land and all
the utensils & tools belonging to the plantation one
hand mill and one negro woman married. Nelly
as long as her natural life or intermarriage —
I also give to my son Charles the plantation where
I now live containing five hundred acres more or less
one horse bridle & saddle by the name of Dick & also
the house & tenall property after the death of my wife
or her intermarriage. I also give my grandson Josiah
Northorn two cows one feather bed furniture & bedstead
thereto belonging. I also give my son Stephen Woolf
one lot of land lying in Wane County containing
four hundred thirty two acres, also my stock of
Hogs Cattle and sheep and one yearling colt and forty
five dollars in the hands of John Elkins. I also
give to my son Charles one feather bed furniture &
bedstead thereto belong. I also give my daughter
Levina Bandy five Dollars and it is my will that
my division shall take place until the first of Decem-
ber next. And I do hereby nominate constitute &
appoint my said wife Executrix, John Wambrockel
& my son Stephen Woolf, Executors of this my last revok-
ing all former wills by me at any time heretofore
made and declaring this only to be my last will
and testament. In witness whereof I have here-
unto set my hand & seal this sixteenth day of
April in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight & fifteen and of America Independence
the thirty ninth.
