State of Georgia, In the name of God. Amos
I Joseph Davis of Savannah in the State aforesaid
being sick and weak in body, but of sound mind and
memory & understanding and considering the uncertainty
of life Do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament, in manner & form following that is to say
Imprimis I will and desire that all my debts be fully
paid and discharged: that the debt which I owe at the
Custom House in Savannah be first paid and next
the Judgment obtained against me in the Federal Court
by Phillip Cohen, and then the debts for which I have been
sued and upon which Judgments are or shall be
obtained against me, These debts I desire may be paid
as soon as possible so that the interest on them may not
accumulate Item: I will and desire that the amount
of Principal which shall or may be due on three certain
promissory notes given by Saul Solomon Esq. to me, and
which notes I have endorsed to Mr. David Lion be immedi-
ately paid to the said David out of my Estate, as he has
agreed to relinquish the interest due on the same, and that
the said notes shall then be put in the hands of Jeremiah
Cuyler Esq. who shall immediately sue the said Saul
Solomon Esq. in the said notes and hold them to bail.
Item: I give and bequeath to my Sister in Honigsburgh the
entire Isaac David the sum of Four thousand Dollars, Item
I give and bequeath to my Brother Janyet Isaac David
of Honigsburgh three thousand Dollars, Item: I give and
bequeath to my Sister Hannah Isaac David of same place
two thousand Dollars, Item I give and bequeath to the
Hebrew Congregation in Charleston one hundred Dollars
Item: I give and bequeath to the Hebrew Congregation
in Philadelphia one hundred Dollars, and to the
Congregation in New York one hundred Dollars.

I give and bequeath to my brother James Isaac David
my Gold watch, two Gold seals, Gold Key and Hair Chain.
Item: I give and bequeath to my Sister Beannin my Picture
and my Diamond ring. Item: I will and desire that
three day after my decease my House and Furniture be
thoroughly cleaned, that the Furniture remain in the same
situation as it was at the time of my decease until
removed to be sold, that the Picture, and other furniture
which may be in the room where I die be not removed
but be covered and remain in the same room until
taken away for the purpose of sale, I desire that
my Furniture be sold by Howe & Simon of Savannah
Auctioneers, and that the same be sold as soon as possi-
ble after my decease, Item: I will and request that my
Stock of goods which are in the Store lately occupied by
Levy. Hart & Co. be sent to Charleston in the State of South
Carolina and there be sold at auction by Campbell
at a Credit of one two or three months, with good security
for all sums above one hundred Dollar, and for sums equal
to or under the amount, for Cash, That a list or schedule of
the goods in the Store I now occupy be taken by Sampson
Mordcaii and two other persons and that the same shall be
carefully packed up and sent to Charleston aforesaid &
be sold there by the said Campbell in like manner as
above directed, That each trunk & package in the said
Store shall be sealed with the seal of one of my Executors
Item: I give and bequeath to the Union of Society in Savannah
fifty dollar and to the Female African in Savannah fifty
Dollar, And as to all the rest or residue of my property
which shall remain after payment of my debts and the
Legacies aforesaid, I give and bequeath the same to my brother
and Sisters above named to be equally divided between them
I hereby make and constitute David Leion executor of
this my Will and hereby revoke all other Wills by me at
any time heretofore made, I hereby desire that Sereniah
bryant Esq. be attorney for my Estate, and be allowed two and
a half per cent for all debts or sums of money he collects
and that the said Sereniah pay the same to my Executor
as soon as received, In Witness whereof I the said Joseph
Davis have hereunto set my hand and seal at Savannah
this fifteenth day of September in the year eighteen hundred
