In the name of God amen. I Joseph Wiles of Darien
chee in the county of Chatham being sick in body but of
sound mind memory and understanding do make this my
last will & testament in manner following, I recommend
my soul to God and my body to the earth.

And whereas some eight or ten years ago I gave to my
wench Phyllis her manumission & freedom, now I do hereby
confirm the same & for her good management & fidelity
I do give & bequeath to my executors herein after named
in trust for her a lot of land in the city of Savan-
nah, back of Mr. Thomas Young & near Mr. Wm. McFall
for her sole & separate use for ever & direct my executors,
Should I not live long enough to putt up and erect
thereon a snug, comfortable house and kitchen for Phyl-
lis, and recommend her to their particular care and
attention.

I give and bequeath to my little negro boy Her-
eunless his freedom and fifty dollars per annum until he
is twenty one years of age & learned a trade so that he
can never be a burthen to the community.

I give and bequeath to my unfortunate daughter
Maria Wiles the sum of five hundred dollars to be
paid out of my estate but without interest.

I give and bequeath to Pharo Mabry's Eldest son
after now living the sum of five hundred dollars
be paid in like manner as my daughter's legacy.

I give and bequeath to John Lyons, an orphan
brought up by me my tract of land in the
Crack-Tick and also all the lots of land in the
other property which his mother bequeathed
him and his heirs for ever.

I have twelve or fourteen brothers

Portugal & the Western Isles and one sister in a numerous family all well off in circumstances & who need no assistance from me.

I give and bequeath to the Commissioners officers of the Chatham Artillery in Savannah for the use of that company the sum of two hundred and fifty Dollars

I give and bequeath to my God child Susannah Statham, daughter of Robert Statham the sum of fifty dollars per annum till she is twenty one years old. -

My will is that Hercules live with and be under the care & management of Phillis until he is of age.

All the rest and residue of my estate Real & personal after the payment of my debts which are inconsiderable including my right and title to Ogeechee Ferry and bridge I give and bequeath to the Female Asylum and Union Society of the same place, to be equally divided between those two Societies, share and share alike for ever.

and I do constitute nominate & appoint, Richard All Stites John Bolton & Jeremiah Cuyler executors of this my last will & Testament revoking all former wills & in particular one made by P. Staby in his favour and requesting him to deliver up the title deeds to my lands and negroes & other papers in his hands to my executors and that they will take charge of my estate during their lives & carry into effect this my will, pay my debts, discharge the legacies & distribute the surplus land residue of my estate between the said charitable Societies from time to time as the same accumulates. And lastly to my executors before named and their heirs I give the privilege of passing at my bridge or ferry free from toll or ferrage. To Sophia Atloff I give five hundred dollars and direct that all my horned cattle be divided between her and wrench Phillis share and share alike.
