Whereas it has been represented to the Honorable the Court
of Ordinary of Chatham County by Harriet Sattnell and
Edward S. Sattnell are entitled with their brother Josiah
Sattnell now a minor to the Estate of Josiah Sattnell Jun^r
deceased that the said Josiah Sattnell Jun^r did pos-
sess of Negroes and other personal property the said
negroes and personal property being the undivided
Estate of the said Harriet Sattnell Edward S. Sattnell
and Josiah Sattnell the said Harriet Sattnell Ed-
ward S. Sattnell and Josiah Sattnell being the only
persons entitled to such Estate. And whereas it has also
been represented that Harriet Sattnell and Edward
S. Sattnell are desirous of having the said negroes and
other personal property divided between them and
that their respective portions may be appointed to them
agreeably to the provisions contained in the act of
Assembly in such cases made and provided. And
whereas it has also been represented and doth appear
by their acknowledgement in writing that the rep-
resentatives of Josiah Sattnell minor have received the
notice prescribed by the act above cited to give effect
to an application of partition of said Estate. These
are therefore to command and require you the said
James Hunter, Noble W Jones Alexander Selfair
George Glen and William Barnard in your proper
persons and in the presence of the parties thereto
agents or Attorneys or Guardians by you to be as-
sured if they will be present you do cause to be

divided and partitioned off the said negroes and other personal estate of the said Josiah Tattnell for division into three equal parts, and respect being had to the value of each part, and the same being so divided you shall cause one third part thereof with the appurtenances to be delivered to Harriet Tattnell, one third thereof to Edward S. Tattnell and the remaining third part thereof to be delivered to Josiah Tattnell Junr or his representatives to be held in severalty so that neither of the said parties have more of the said personal estate than to him or her of right belongeth. And the said partition so by you or a majority of you made as aforesaid under your hands and seals or the hands and seals of a majority of you have you before the Honorable the Court of Chancery of Chatham County in Savannah within three months from the date hereof together with this Writ.

Witness the Honorable George Jones Esq. one of the Judges of the said Court this fourth day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifteen and of the independence of the United States of America the fortieth
