In the name of God, amen, I Joseph Page of the County of Chatham, district of White Bluff (oversee) being in weak bodily strength but in sound mind and memory (blessed be God therefor) do this nineteenth day of January one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and in the 36th year of American Independence, make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, to wit: Inprimis, I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it me, and my body to the earth from whence it came, in hopes of a

joyful resurrection, through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ, and as for that worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me, I dispose thereof as follows. —

First I give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas Page my negro fellow Andrew, during his life time to possess and employ him, and after the decease of my brother the said negro Andrew shall return to William Page my brother.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved and much respected mother Margaret Page, my negro Girl Sally to have and possess during her life time as her own, and after her decease the said negro Sally shall return to William Page my Brother.

Thirdly, I give unto my Nephew Joseph Page Lindsey my negro man Emanuel in this wise, that is to say, during the life time of my mother, my brother William Page will keep in his possession and service the negro Emanuel and at the decease of my mother, he will then give up the said negro Emanuel in the hands of Joseph Page Lindsey, as his own property. —

Fourthly, I give and bequeath unto my brother William Page my negro man Moussa, to him and his heirs and assigns, and also all my property that is to say, all debt that may be due me, after paying all my just demands, all my house furniture, horse, and all my remaining property, and I also leave my brother William Page this my last will and testament to be by him carefully executed, he being my executor, and I charge him in particular, not to make any division of this my estate untill all my debts are settled, and that my estate shall be clear. In Witness Whereof I have set my hand and seal to this my last Will and testament disavowing all others, signed sealed in presence of
