Chatham County I Joseph Shultz of the County aforesaid
in the state aforesaid being of sound mind &
understanding but considering the infirmities of age
do make this my last will and testament
my Solee to my Creditors and my

buried in a plain and decent manner, and my debts paid
and I do hereby direct, that all the just debts which I shall
leave at my death and also my funeral expenses, shall be
paid by my executors hereinafter named, as soon as conveniently
can be after my decease, As to such estate of which I am
possessed, I dispose of as follows, I give and bequeath unto
my beloved mother Jane Briggs one hundred dollars yearly and
every year (payable quarterly if required) during her natural life
I give an bequeath unto my daughter Jane Ann Stutz a little
property I shall die possessed of both real & personal subject
nevertheless to the legacies contained in this my Will and should
the said Jane Ann Stutz live to attain the age of twenty one years
or day of marriage the same to be for her and her heirs forever
But in Case the said Jane Ann Stutz should depart this life before
she attains the age of twenty one or after marriage should die without
issue, then and in that case I do hereby order and direct that the
property above devised to the said Jane Ann Stutz, shall be sold
and the monies arising from the sale shall be divided into four
equal parts, which said fourth parts, shall go and be vested in the
persons herein after named and their heirs - viz: one fourth to be
equally divided between my executors hereinafter named and their
heirs, One fourth part between Margaret and Eliza Adams daughters
of Edmund Adams deceased my Nieces to them and their heirs forever
one other four to my half Brother Samuel Briggs his heirs and
spouse forever, And one other fourth part between my Sister Elizabeth
Parker (wife of Ebenezer Parker) Children to be managed & kept for
them by my executors till the respectively arrive at the age of
twenty one years or day of marriage, - It is likewise my desire
that immediately after my decease, my daughter Jane Ann Stutz
be boarded in a respectable and decent family till she arrives
at the age of twenty one years or day of marriage, and that
she receive a decent and competent education
It is likewise my will that George Stutz Parker receive a decent
education from my estate, and when bound to a trade or
Negro boy be purchased for him by my executors bound to the
same trade, which said Negro boy shall be fully vested in him
when the said George Stutz Parker arrives at the age of twenty one
years, And lastly I do constitute and appoint Mr. John C.
Chapin, Captain George Clark & Robert S. Gibson executors
of this my will,
