ing the uncertainty of this mortal life, do will, order
and ordain in manner and form following that
is to say. That the whole of my property & interest
shall be kept together for the benefit of my four chil-
dren Joseph, William, Emeline and Albert I. and
no division of it to take place until the youngest
shall come of age, or is married at which time it
is to be equally divided among the then survivors
leaving it to my executors herein after named to
apply the said property as they shall see most be
beneficial for the said interest, and the support of my
children, applying the annual income to their
relief, proportionately. And I do hereby nominate &
appoint the following persons to be the executors of
this my last Will and testament Viz. John Couper &
William Page of St. Simons Island esquires James
White esq of Savannah and my eldest son Joseph
Turner at present of St Simons. Reserving hereby
all other Wills or Testaments by me made

Savannah the twenty Sixth day of February in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and thirteen.
