and State of Georgia Merchant, being at present very
weak of body, but of sound mind and memory
and intending with the will of God, soon to embark
on a distant voyage am inclined to make this my
last Will and Testament.

I give devise and bequeath to my brother William
Whitfield for the purchase of mourning the sum of
one hundred dollars, also all my claim to a piece
of land bequeathed by Mrs James Jackson to our
brother Thomas, of which I am entitled to a moiety
as one of his heirs, also my watch and wearing ap-
parel if to be found. I give devise and bequeath
to Philip William Crawford Robertson, to whom I am
bound by an ardent affection, the rest and residue
of my estate real and personal to have and to hold
the same to himself his heirs and assigns forever.
It is my wish to have exchanged if possible my moiety of
Lot No 6 in front of the Friends Ward in the City of Sa-
vannah, for my brother's moiety of Lot No 6 Belithers Ty-
rannards, so my brother's moiety of the improvements
on the latter lot may counter balance the moiety central
situation of the former, any difference in value
must be made up in Cash: to this I solicit the attention
of my executor, it being my desire that the whole of the ap-
said Lot No 6 Belithers Tyrannards be
owned by Mrs Robertson rather than a moiety of
both lots. To the said William C. Robertson I give
as aforesaid my ten shares in the Stock of the planters
Bank, also any profits that may be due to me arising
from the business of Johnston & Whitfield, and all
and every other property that I may be possessed of
at my decease, I give devise and bequeath to the aforesaid
William to himself, his heirs and assigns forever, and I do
hereby nominate and appoint my best friend and friend
father Col. James Johnston executor and his niece William
C. Robertson executrix of this my only Will, as witness
my hand and seal the twelfth November 1812 -
