And I also give and bequeath to my said son Thomas Driscoll my negro wench and her child to him his heirs and assigns, but if my said son (Thomas Driscoll) should die before he attains the age of twenty one years then and in that case it is my wish and my will that what I have given and bequeathed to my said son (Thomas Driscoll) shall go and I give devise and bequeath to my brother Lawrence Mahony & my sister Elizabeth Mahony of the Town of Youghall County of Cork Ireland share and share alike their heirs executors, administrators & assigns. And I lastly give devise and bequeath to my husband Timothy Driscoll the sloop with all her tackle, apparel and furniture, and also all my stock in bags and shop furniture, and I do hereby appoint my husband Timothy Driscoll, Doctor Bourgeois and Pettibone, Executors of this my will. Witness my hand this ninth day of September one thousand eight hundred
