

Georgia. In the name of God Amen: I, Martha  
Garrison Campbell of the City of Savannah in the State  
aforesaid, spinster, being mindful of the uncertainty  
of life & being of sound disposing mind & memory,  
do make this my last will & Testament as follows that is  
to say,

I Inquire, I give bequeath and devise to my be-  
loved niece Sarah Fenwick Jones, daughter of my sis-  
ter Sarah Jones, the negro girl named Hannah, daugh-  
ter of my mulatto slave named Mary, to hold the  
said slave named Hannah, with her future issue & in-  
crease to my said niece Sarah Fenwick Jones her heirs  
and assigns for ever.

Item. I hereby manumit and set free my negro  
woman named Jonguilla and her children Mary Smart  
and Clarendon and the future issue of the said female  
slaves in consideration of the faithful services of the said  
negro woman Jonguilla and I do charge my executors  
~~that~~ hereinafter named to use all necessary and proper  
means to have the freedom of the said negro woman named  
Jonguilla and her children named Smart & Clarendon & the  
future issue of the said females fully and perfectly estab-  
lished by law.

Item. I give bequeath and devise to my beloved  
sister Harriet Campbell my undivided moiety or half  
part of all that tract of land situate in the County of  
Richmond and State of Georgia known by the name of  
Canoe Creek plantation containing in the whole five hun-  
dred acres, which said plantation or tract of land is  
held by my said sister and myself as tenants in common  
and also all my negro slaves and other estate, real and  
personal not herein above devised, and all the residue of  
my property and estate, real and personal whatsoever  
to have & to hold to the said Harriet Campbell her  
heirs & assigns for ever. And lastly I do hereby constitute  
and appoint my said sister Harriet Campbell sole  
trustee of this my last will and Testament hereby  
annulling and revoking all former wills by me made and declaring  
this to be my last will and Testament.

In witness whereof I the said Martha Gadsden  
Campbell have hereunto set my hand and seal this  
twenty first day of January in the year of our Lord  
one thousand eight hundred and thirteen  
signed, sealed, published, Martha G. Campbell S.S.  
and declared by Martha Gadsden

den Campbell the above named testatrix as and for  
her last will & testament in the presence of us who, at  
her request in her presence and in the presence of each  
other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto. the  
word "named" in the twenty first line of the first page  
being first intimated.
