

I Mary Barnard being sick and weak in body but of sound mind memory understanding, do make this my last will and testament - first I commend my soul to The Lord wishing & trusting in a free pardon of all my sins. I commit my body to the earth after such a manner as my executor or executors shall direct - And as to my worldly estate I dispose of it thus:

1. First. I desire that all my just debts and funeral expences may be paid as early after my death as possible
2. I give and bequeath to Jane Williams, the wife of D. D. Williams & her heirs my wench Sylvia or Symena and her future issue.
3. If my attending physician approves of the conduct of my nurse Comfort belonging to Mr Benjamin Hall, it is my desire that my executor purchase the freedom of the said wench Comfort for which purchase I appropriate three hundred Dollars. - And in case the freedom of said wench cannot be purchased I give and bequeath the said sum of three hundred Dollars to the said wench Comfort - this sum I wish to be exclusive of her wages. -
4. I wish the whole of my property real and personal not here in before disposed of to be sold by my executor and the half of the neat proceeds, I give and bequeath to the following persons, viz Duack, belonging to Nicholas. Caesar Mc Credie formerly belonging to Capt. Kennedy of Augusta Nancy belonging to the said Nicholas Foxe, and Tom Paris, formerly belonging to the said Nicholas Foxe.
5. I give and bequeath my watch to Philip Minis the son of Isaac Minis

6 All the residue of my property or funds which may be in the hands of my executors after the discharge of the within bequests I give and bequeath to - Wiles the son of Elijah Wiles deceased to be designated by Mr Isaac Minis.

I do hereby appoint Isaac Minis sole executor of this my last will and testament - Witness my hand this fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred & fiftythree Mary Barnard
