this my last will and testament - first I commend
my soul to the Lord wishing & trusting in a free for-
giveness of all my sins. I commit my body to the earth after
such a manner as my executor or executors shall direct
And as to my worldly estate I dispose of it thus:

1. First. I desire that all my just debts and funeral
expenses may be paid, as early after my death as possible.
2. I give and bequeath to Jane Williams, the wife of
D. D. Williams & her heirs my wench Sylvia or Symone
and her future issue.
3. If my attending physician approves of the conduct of my
wife Comfort belonging to Mrs Benjamin Hall, it is my de-
sire that my executor purchase the freedom of the said em-
ployee comfort for which purchase I appropriate three
hundred Dollars. - And in case the freedom of said wench
cannot be purchased I give and bequeath the said sum
of three hundred Dollars to the said wench comfort this
sum I wish to be exclusive of her wages.
4. I wish the whole of my property real and personal not here
in before disposed of to be sold by my executors and the half of
the net proceeds, I give and bequeath to the following per-
sons, viz Quack, belonging to Nicholas Caesar McCredie
formerly belonging to Capt^r Kennedy of Augusta Nancy be-
longing to the said Nicholas Fox, and Tom Paris, formerly
belonging to the said Nicholas Fox.
5. I give and bequeath my watch to Philip Dennis the son of
Isaac Dennis.
6. All the residue of my property or funds which may be in
the hands of my executors after the discharge of the above
bequests I give and bequeath to — Wells the son of Eli-
jah Wells deceased to be designated by me hereafter.

I do hereby appoint Isaac Dennis sole executor of
this my last will and testament. Without my hand this
fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred
and fifty five
