the City of Savannah in Chatham County widow
do make & ordain this my last will & testament to wit
I give & bequeath unto Benjamin More & Richard More
all my grandchildren the house & lot which I now
live in being situated in the said City of Savannah
New Franklin Ward, together with all & thing whatsoever
house hold furniture and kitchen utensils, which I now
now possessed of, also I give unto said Benjamin &
Richard More an account I have against the estate
of Richard More dec^d amounting to the sum of five
hundred and forty dollars, which house & lot, household
furniture & amount against said estate, (when settled)
are to be applied to the maintenance &c of the said Ben-
jamin & Richard More until they come to the years of
discretion or maturity, when, and not before, shall be
equally divided between them the said Benjamin &
Richard More, nevertheless my will is that my daugh-
ter Ann More should equally enjoy a part or the
whole of the above property during her life time in such
manner as she may think proper either by living in said
house or renting it for his and children's support also to
apply the money collected from the estate of Richard More
in such manner as she may think most for the benefit
of the said children, either in schooling of them
or purchasing any species of property which she may think
will be beneficial. And the more effectually to have
this my last will & testament carried out & effectuated
and applied to the use for which it is intended
hereby constitute & appoint _____ as my execu-
tor of this my last will, together with my said daughter

Anne More whom I appoint as my executrix with
full & complete power in every instance to act
as such. Signed sealed and acknowledged as
my will & testament this third day of April
