State aforesaid Widow do make declare and publish this
my last Will and Testament, that is to say, I give
devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughters Caroline
Ann Fraser, and Harriett Maria Fraser my tract of
land on Port Royal Island aforesaid called Springfield
whereon Mr John Richardson now resides, to them
and their heirs forever as tenants in common, but
in case either of my said daughters should marry
die without issue, or die unmarried, then and in such
case, I do give devise and bequeath the said tract of
land to the survivor of them, and to her heirs forever
forever. I do also give and bequeath unto my
daughters all my furniture in my house in Port
Royal, bedding and bed linen, Table & table linen,
Glass Household and Kitchen Furniture of every
kind, also all my table, desert and tea spoons and
milk pot cream and sugar buckets, and
all of Silver, and having the family chest,
pot, also all my Horses, Carriages, Coach

with my stock of every kind and description, Cattle Sheep
Hogs, and poultry to them and to their executors administrators
and assigns forever share and share alike. all the rest residue
and remainder of my estate real and personal I give devise
and bequeath unto the whole of my children to be equally
divided between them and their respective heirs assigns
Forever and Lastly I do hereby nominate constitute and
appoint my daughters Caroline Ann Fraser and Harriett
Marie Fraser executors of this my last Will & Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this
25 day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand &
eight hundred and ten, Mary Fraser Lt.

them, silver dish and cover and stand, set of castors,
pair of Porter Cups, with pair of waiters to match them
dish cross for the Table, Coffee Urn, and any other article
of plate I may be possess^r of, excepting only those articles
that I have already bequeathed in my Will to my beloved
daughters, Caroline A. Fraser, and Harriett M. Fraser, and
I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint by beloved
sons George Fraser, John S. Fraser and Alexander G.
Fraser (as soon as he becomes of age) executors in con-
junction with their sisters C. A. Fraser, and Harriett M. Fraser
to this my last Will. Mary Fraser.
