of sound mind, declare this to be my last will & testament

I desire that all my estate, real & personal, excepting
only such articles as are herein after mentioned be
sold & the money produced from such sale to be paid
at interest after paying all my just debts.

Second. all the plate, jewels & trinkets which I may
be or now am possessed of I will & bequeath to my
grand daughter Ann Reynolds and her heirs for ever.

Third - My negro woman Nancy and her issue I will
& bequeath also to my aforesaid grand daughter Ann
Reynolds and her heirs for ever, and therefore desire
that the said Nancy and her issue may not be sold with
my other effects

Fourthly. To my aforesaid grand daughter Ann Reynolds,
I will & bequeath the whole of my estate real & personal
to her and her heirs for ever, but in the event of her
death before the age of fourteen years I request that
whatever of my said estate may remain shall be equally
divided between my surviving brothers & sisters

Fifthly. I request that my Brother Alexander Jones
in conjunction with Isaac R. Douglass & W. J. Wil-
liams do act as my executors, and as the Guardians
of my grand daughter Ann Reynolds

Sixthly. I request that my aforesaid Executors will
cause my before mentioned grand daughter Ann to be
as soon as convenient sent to a proper place, either in
Bathlehen or elsewhere to complete her education
in such manner as shall be judged best.

I hereby declare this to be my only will &
that all others made at any time before are null
& void & of none effect. Dated in Savannah State of
Georgia the tenth day of October in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred & fifteen.
