State of Georgia

I Owen Owens of St. Charles^{Island}
in the County of Liberty and State aforesaid, ^{planted}
being in health of body and of sound mind
memory, understanding and discretion, do make
this my last Will & Testament in manner & form
following:— First it is my Will and desire that all
my just debts be paid. — Second I give and bequeath
unto my Nephew Owen Owens, Pell two thousand dollars
payable in two years after my decease. — Third I give
and bequeath to my Nephew Owen Jones two thousand
Dollars payable in two years after my decease.

Fourth: I will and desire and hereby
direct my executor hereinafter named, to pay to
Penelope Steward of Savannah, three hundred
dollars annually from the day of my decease, for
and during the term of the natural life of her
the said Penelope: and my said executor is hereby
directed & required to be punctual in the payment
of said annuity to the said Penelope Steward.

Lastly: All the rest residue remain-
and of my said estate, real or personal, of what kind
or nature soever, whereof I am now seized, & possessed
or may depart this life seized & possessed as afore-
said I bequeath to my dearly beloved Son Georgian^{Will} Owens
of Savannah in the said State of Georgia Esq. coun-
sellor at Law, to have and to hold the same to him the
said Georgian^{Will} Owens, his heirs, executors, administrators
& assigns forever, and I do hereby ordain, nominate,
constitute, declare and appoint the said Georgian^{Will} Owens

to be the executor of this my last will and Testament
hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.

I the said Owen Owens do hereby set my hand and seal this seventh day
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and ten
