State of Georgia. In the name of God amen.
I Patrick McInty, of the County of Chatham
in the State aforesaid being of sound mind and
memory, but knowing that it is appointed for
all men to die, do make this my last will & testa-
ment, first I give and recommend my soul to God,

that gave it, and my body, to the earth, hoping by the
almighty power of God to be remembered with the blessed
as to my worldly estate I dispose of the same in the
following manner, that is to say, I give & bequeath
to my wife Catherine McKenty, a negro Girl named
Beck and a negro Girl named Bet, during the
time of her natural life in lieu and place of her
dower, after her and my death I give the negro
Beck to Catherine Remshart, her first born to be
given to Peggy Remshart, the negro girl Bet
I give and bequeath to Thomas Gibben after the
death of my wife and myself. All the remainders
and residue of my property I give & bequeath
unto Daniel McCarty of the Kingdom of Ireland
County of Antrim and town of Larne and to
his heirs and assigns forever, after the death of my
wife and myself, one tract of land more particularly
bridged bounded Southwardly by Thomas
Gibbons Northwardly by Peter Proulx, West
wardly by the Augusta road, one house in
Savannah and lot No 11 City (30) Elbert
Ward, one feather Bed and Furniture.

I request my executor to cut out my plan-
tation, giving no liberty to cut wood except
for plantation use, and also my house and
lot in Savannah, my executor are authorized
either to sell said property, or to keep it till
said Daniel McCarty is naturalized. I do
hereby appoint Daniel Remshart & Thomas
Gibben as executors of last will & testament.
