Item 1st. I give devise & bequeath to my beloved
wife Nancy Houston and to my infant daughter Sa-
rah the house in which I now reside in Washington
Wards together with all the house and kitchen furniture
appertaining to the same and to the child with which
my said wife Nancy is pregnant I give devise and be-
queath (when born) our equal share of the above premises
and I do hereby nominate my said Guardian J. M. Wayne
Esq. their trustee to the same.

Item 2^d. I give devise & bequeath to my beloved mo-
ther Dolly Houston my small house or shed with the ground
on which it stands on the back part of Lot No. 7. Car-
penters Row Washington Wards and also the sum
of fifty dollars to be paid to her out of my estate in
six months after my decease & I do nominate and
appoint J. M. Wayne Esq her trustee for the same

Item 3^d. I leave the children of my sister Esther
Lloyd & Elizabeth Gordon the sum of fifty Dollars to be

paid immediately after my decease for the express purpose of purchasing mourning.

Item 4th. I leave to my beloved children for the sum of four hundred and fifty Dollars cash to be paid them immediately after my decease out of what money I have in Bank, and also all the rest and residue of my estate not above named & I do appoint as trustee for the same J. M. Wayne Esquire.

Item 5th I do hereby nominate and appoint George Anderson & Jeremiah Cuyler Esquires as executors to this my last will and testament.

Made, published & declared in the presence of us this first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.
