I Sarah Bailey, of the City of Savannah and State of  
Georgia Spinster being of sound mind memory and under  
standing, but knowing the uncertainty of life, do make  
this my last Will and Testament in manner & form following  
First I will and desire that I may be decently buried and  
all my just debts paid.

Item I give and bequeath to John Drysdale of the City of  
Savannah my Slaves Peggy and Dalmany his Executors  
Administrators and assigns, to hold the same with  
their issue, in Trust to and for the sole use and benefit  
of Laleah H. Watty wife of Robert Watty and to be  
wholly at her disposal, by will or otherwise as she may  
think proper, and without being in any manner subject

to the debt or controul of her said husband  
Item I give and bequeath to Eliza J. Drysdale and her  
assigns forever my negro boy Sumner.  
Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Aunt Sarah  
Drysdale, Eliza Irvine and Rachel Johnston all of  
Savannah aforesaid, all my money, securities,  
for money, goods, chattels, Estate and effects of what  
nature or kind soever, and whereever the same  
may be at the time of my death (with the exception  
of the three slaves bequeathed as aforesaid,) to be equally  
divided between them and the survivors of them  
share and share alike,  
And Lastly I do nominate constitute and  
appoint my said Aunt Sarah Drysdale, Eliza  
Irvine and Rachel Johnston, Executors of this  
my last Will and Testament hereby revoking  
and making void, all and every other Wills  
or Wills at any time by me heretofore made,  
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and Seal the fourteenth day of February in the  
year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twelve
