Wright, of Middlesex & Wright wife of the James Wright Baronet of  
Little Ealing and County aforesaid, being of sound mind & memory  
do make this my last Will & Testament.

Impromis. After paying the debts if any there be against my property.  
I give and bequeath to my nephew John McQueen of Georgia  
South America, my lot and house, in Savannah, bequeathed  
to me by mother's will - and likewise to the said John Mc  
Queen my part of the Bluff left me by my mother -

2<sup>ndly</sup> I give to my niece Margaret McQueen the following Slaves  
viz. Ishmael and namely his wife and son Ardam

3<sup>rdly</sup> I give to my niece Maryanne Cooper the Slave, Diana and  
all her children, likewise Jane & his wife Hagar, and their chil-  
dren viz. Jack, Paul and Jacob, their daughter Tenah I  
shall hereafter mention -

4<sup>thly</sup> I give to my niece Eliza Mackay the Slave Jesse, son of  
Jane and Hagar -

5<sup>thly</sup> And to Maryanne Mackay my great niece I give the  
negro girl Tenah for her waiting maid -

6<sup>thly</sup> I bequeath to my niece Sarah Williamson the Slaves Joe,  
and Jpsy, and a Silver Cup left me by  
mother I likewise give to her. And I desire, before the  
property is divided, it shall furnish the sum of Fifty guineas  
for a watch and seals which I leave to my Nephew William  
McQueen, and likewise the sum of ten guineas for a seal  
I give to my Nephew James Wright, as a small token of  
my affection for him -

I leave to my friend Mr. Heron five guineas for a mourning  
ring -

My own watch I give to my niece Catherine Ponke as her  
Sister has one, and to my niece Elizabeth Ponke my gold  
chains and Locket, with my Father's and mother's hair in it -

All my other trinkets I leave to Maryanne Cooper -

To Maryanne Mackay I give a Bible two guineas value.

But in case these my Slaves are already disposed of by my  
Attorney John McQueen, which I gave him full power to do, if  
he has not done so I do then hereby give the value of each Slave  
before named agreeable to the average sum they sold for viz.

To Margaret McQueen I give the value of two Slaves -

To Sarah Williamson I give the value of three Slaves -

To Eliza Mackay the value of one Slave, and to Mary Anne  
Mackay the value of one Slave - To Mary Anne Cooper  
the value of the six Slaves left to her - making in all  
together the number of thirteen Slaves - maintained in  
my mother's will except Diana this family which remains  
the same to her Mary Anne Cooper - In case of any  
deficiency - to supply these bequests, to the value of one Slave  
left - that must be taken out of the number I left to  
Mary Anne Cooper from Hagars children -

All the above mentioned property, being bequeathed to me by  
my mother's will under the restriction of leaving the same  
to some one or more of her own family, is the reason of my  
not mentioning my husband herein, and this my last  
Will and testament is made conformable thereto, written  
with my own hand the year of our Lord one thousand  
Eight hundred and thirteen, the twenty sixth day of  
August. And I do hereby nominate and appoint John  
McQueen Esquire of Georgia North Carolina my sole executor  
of the same

purporting to be the Will of the said Sarah Wright  
is in her own hand writing and the signature  
"Sarah Wright" thereto subscribed is the proper hand  
writing and signature of the said Sarah Wright  
Sworn in Open Court
