I, Susannah Miller, widow of the City of Savannah, County of Chatham & State of Georgia being weak of body, but of sound & perfect memory, blessed be God for the same, do publishing this my last will & testament in manner & form as follows, that is to say, First. I desire my funeral expences and all my just debts paid. Secondly - I give & bequeath unto my beloved grand-children, Minors, Joseph Josiah Wilkinson and Sarah Ann Wilkinson by my lawful daughter Susannah Miller, and after my decease, that is to say one tract of land in the District of White Bluff containing fifty eight acres three Rods & thirty perches more or less, bounded &c. as will more fully appear by reference to the County Records of Book B. B. (folio 85 & 86) eighty five & eighty six, and also my negro slaves viz. Toby, Isaac, Charlotte, Agar, Coby & Sarah, also my house on half-Lot No. Washington Ward, being or situated on the West side of said Lot in the City of Savannah lying & being forty five feet on Habersham Street, and Sixty feet on Bay Lane, Westwardly, ~~assigning for ever~~ unto them to share & share alike unto them their heirs and assigns for ever, I also give grant & bequeath unto my beloved friend Mary Camd my other house & out buildings on half Lot in the City of Savannah lying & being in Washington Ward, Habersham Street the Houses being situated on the East Side & corner of the above mentioned half Lot. also all my house hold and kitchen furniture, consisting of one side Board Beaureau, two Beds, all my Tables Silver table knifes and all & every other part of my furniture. And lastly, I hereby appoint Executors of this my last will & testament William W. Bulloch and John Shaw Esquires of Savannah & Morton Wilkinson Esq. of Beaufort District of South Carolina & hereby revoking all former wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fourteenth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & sixteenth & the forty first year of the Independence of the United States of America.
