To my niece Elizabeth Wallatton the wife of Paul Wallatton and to the heirs of her body I give the Eastern half, or moiety of my aforesaid lot in principal Ward with improvements thereon, together with a negro girl named Venus, and her future issue, none of the property left to my niece Elizabeth Wallatton to be subject to the debts of her present or any future Husband. To John the son of ^{Chatham Co. Wills Book C, 1808-1817} ~~my said wife~~ ^{www.georgiapioneers.com} I give a negro boy named Toby. To ~~the daughter of my said wife~~ ^{the daughter of my said wife} I give a negro girl named Rachack with her future issue. To Selina the daughter of my said wife I give one hundred Dollars. To my nephew William Miller I give a negro man named Tom, To Elizabeth Miller the daughter of David Miller, I give a negro girl named Minty with her future issue. To my nephew David Miller I give one hundred Dollars. To my nieces, Dorcas Miller, Isabella Miller, Susannah Miller, & Sarah Miller, I give one hundred Dollars each, and every one ^{of said} last mentioned nieces. The residue and remainder of my Estate, I give the use and benefit thereof to my wife Mary during her natural life time, and at the death of my said wife. I give the said residue & remainder to my niece Elizabeth Wallatton the wife of Paul Wallatton, and to heirs of her body and not to be subject to any of the debts of her present or future husband.

I appoint my Wife Mary Executrix and
Paul J. Waldron, and John Dixon Executors
of this my last Will & Testament revoking
all wills heretofore made by me.
