

The last Will and Testament of Thomas August 1847
of the City of Savannah In the name of God amen
I Thomas August considering the
certainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind,
memory & understanding. Blessed be Almighty
God for the same, do make and publish this
my last Will & Testament in manner and form
following that is to say After all my just debts
& funeral expences are paid I then give and
bequeath unto my beloved friend William Moore
at present of the City of Savannah the one half
of all my Estate both Real & Personal of whatever
nature and Secondly I give and bequeath unto
my friend Charles Ruster the Partner of said
William Moore the other remaining half of my
property or use of my said Estate that is
to say after all necessary Expences are paid and
I hereby Authorise nominate & appoint the afore
said William Moore and Charles Ruster as
my Executors to this my last Will and Testament
and moreover authorise empower and appoint
them my said Executors to ask sue for and
demand and receive all my Wages that are due
and owing to me by and from the American Ship
Doctors of New York her Owners Agents or consignees
and when the said Wages are by them recovered and
received to Convert the same to their own proper
use and benefit to be divided between equally
Share and Share alike which amount of said
wages I believe to the best of my recollection to be
about three hundred and sixty five Dollars which
my said Executors are hereby by me authorised
and empowered to receive as aforesaid I'm witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
the twenty eighth day of October in the year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty

William Cahill subscribed their names as wit-

ness thereto at the request of the testator in
his presence & in the presence of each other
