that distribution share of my late Brother's Estate
Townsend D. Baldwin deceased.

I hereby appoint the said James Joseph Jefferson
sole Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby
revoking all former Wills by me made, In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Savannah the
Ninth day of Sept. one thousand eight hundred and twenty
five and sealed, published and signed D. Baldwin (D.B.)
by the above named David Baldwin
