Testament of Charity Clark
of the County State aforesaid Widow

I give devise and
bequeath unto James Willson of the County & State
aforesaid and to his executors and administrators
my three mulatto Slaves named Savannah Ann
and Joe with the future issue and increase of
the females upon this express condition that he
the said James Willson shall permit the said
Slaves with the future issue and increase of
the females to work and labor wheresoever they
lawfully may without any let or hindrance
from the said James Willson his executors or ad-
ministrators that the said James and the future
issue of the females paying to the said James
Willson his executor or administrators each the
sum of one dollar annually and every year
during their lives respectively.

I give devise
and bequeath to the said James Willson his
executors and administrators my negro man
named Bob upon the express Condition that
he appropriate the proceeds arising from the

work and labour of the said Negro slave to the 1st support and maintenance of the aforesaid slave Savannah Nancy & her and the future issue and females so long as Rob is able to labour and if he should become old and superannuated then my will is that he be supported from the labor of Savannah Nancy & her I hereby nominate and appoint the said James Stillson Executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name this 17th day of April 1818.
