In the Name of God. To all persons
 living, it is known that I Peter Sisson being an
 Father of the said Betty Sisson and her mother
 and her mother and my beloved wife Betty Sisson my
 wife follow Beathan and my friend Clarissa to
 assist with her father and me to have and hold the
 said fellow Beathan and the friend Clarissa with
 us often during the natural life of my said wife
 and after her death to the only proper use and benefit
 of my three children, my son Betty and daughter
 and daughter and their heirs and the survivors the
 share of each shall descend. I do also leave and
 bequeath to my said wife all my monies however dis-
 posable and must not called the same to be in
 my proper use and benefit. I do also will and bequeath
 to my said wife Betty the use of my buildings on the
 1st of January 1840 in the South Common for her use
 and occupation during her natural life and if
 any dispute shall arise between the right of disposing
 of the said buildings and appropriation in proceeds
